Carina Lopes is accountable for the research and deliberation area of the Digital Future Society programme, which brings together world-renowned experts from the public and private sectors, academia and civil society organizations to explore and propose practical recommendations within four verticals: the future of work, digital divide, data governance, and finally technology and climate emergency. Previously, she worked as d-LAB Program Manager, responsible for its strategy and implementation back in 2016. d-LAB was a laboratory of technology pilots in Barcelona that supported the arrival of disruptive technological solutions in the market with a high social impact.

With an international experience of more than 10 years, Carina Lopes has worked with local governments, international organizations, and social entrepreneurs to accelerate and grow technological solutions for the common good. Previously, at Citymart (2012-15) she led innovation projects with cities such as Barcelona, Moscow and Athens, local government teams in the US, South Africa, Japan and Brazil, and with the 100 Resilient Cities initiative (Rockefeller).

She has also supported the Agenda 21 Culture Commission, which belongs to the world's largest association of cities and local governments (UCLG), on cultural issues, local urban governance and economic development. Carina holds a PhD in Cultural Studies (2016) from Goldsmiths College, University of London.
